Actions You Can Take at School

Teachers/Students/Parents

Decide what can be recycled in a school depends on what types of materials are being thrown away and the market that will accept the collected items. The easiest and most common material to recycle in a school is paper. Many schools also recycle aluminum, clothing, printer cartridges and more!

Who organizes the program? It could be a group of students, a committee of parents, a teacher or administrator. Whoever it is, it is important to have someone who is responsible for the program.

What to recycle? If the material you decide to recycle is paper, you will probably need a container for every classroom.

Educate! The success of a recycling program depends on how well people participate. Make sure that everyone involved knows what to do and why it is important. There are many ways to do this: assembly programs, announcements, posters, contests, research projects, guest speakers, etc. The EPA have curriculum to meet in-class goals.

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle
Recycle school or classroom paper, newspapers, beverage containers, electronic equipment and batteries. Reducing, reusing and recycling at school and in the classroom helps conserve energy, reduce pollution and greenhouse gases from resource extraction, manufacturing and disposal. You can reduce, reuse and recycle at school or in the classroom by using two-sided printing and copying; buying supplies made with recycled content; and recycling used printer cartridges. For your old electronics, investigate leasing programs to ensure reuse and recycling or donate used equipment to schools or other organizations.

Quick Facts

Paper

By recycling or reusing 1 ton of paper, we save 17 trees, 7,000 gallons of water, 463 gallons of oil, 3 cubic yards of landfill space, and enough energy to heat an average home for 6 months.

Plastic

Milk jugs can be made into all different types of plastic objects, from park benches to boardwalks.

Aluminum

Recycling aluminum cans saves 95 percent of the energy required to make aluminum cans from scratch.

Glass

If all the glass bottles and jars recycled were laid end-to-end, they would reach the moon and make it more than halfway back to Earth.

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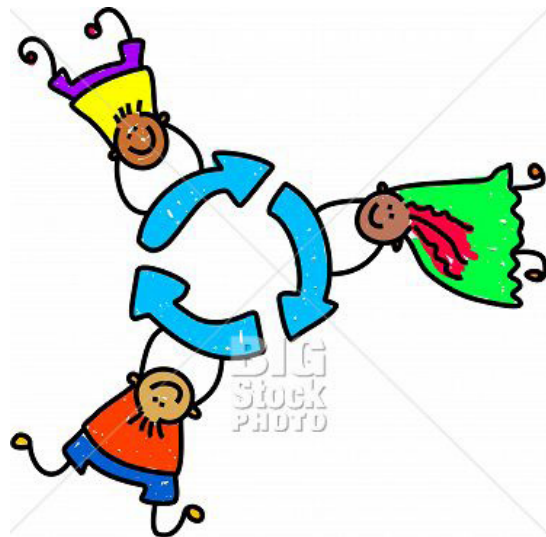
